Sharing Visions Together: The experience of the students of Pavia attending the Ec2u event in Coimbra

During the first week of May, around 115 students from the seven partner <u>EC2U</u>
Alliance Universities and from University of Lviv (strategic associated partner) attended the EC2U Students' Week in Coimbra, Portugal. In this article, the voice of UNIPV students is stressed, indeed this is a **text made by students for the students**.

One of the main goals of the EC2U alliance is promoting mobility between students, professors and administrative staff. This was the perfect occasion for students and staff to meet and sharing experience during a one week short mobility.

The University of Pavia was represented by 18 students coming from different fields of studies and one staff member representing the Ec2U WP2 " Culture & Campus life".

On the 2nd of May, the Students' Week kick-started with a welcome session: the Vice-rector of internationalization, the local coordinator of EC2U, and the president of the Student's Association of Coimbra wished us a great week. And it really was! After this initial moment of greetings, we walked towards the Mondego river where a full day of activities was planned for us. Some students did some canoeing in the river, others did Yoga, others played games meant to increase team building, others observed the sun from a special telescope and others participated in a body movement workshop.

On the 3rd of May, we had the opportunity to create music together with Transbal Express, a lovely band from Poitiers, whose goal is to play various and typical songs from all over the world. In the afternoon then we moved to the University to do a formal English-style debate where students had to discuss prioritization of social policies in youth and intercultural mobility programs.

On the 4th of May, we had the chance to participate in a COP simulation, which is an international climate change meeting held by the UN, where we had the opportunity to represent a country and present, debate and advance motions meant to tackle climate-

related issues. It was interesting because we could grasp the intricacies and the 'slowness' that may be present in these kinds of meetings

These activities helped us build a connection and get comfortable with each other. And to me, this was really what this week was all about: getting comfortable in your own skin and with others, but mostly even putting yourself in other people's shoes. It really was a safe space where we could push ourselves to be more of what we love of ourselves without fears of being judged and scrutinized. We surely think that it's very important to develop critical thinking to build our own opinion about the reality around us.
